




A. ADMINISTRATIVE:

- 1. SDC: We have executed a contract extension for one more (and final) year through 7/1/2025. At the request of the State we are currently staffing SDC (Station 10) on Saturdays and Sundays.
- 2. KWD: Staffing service continues to go very well. Especially of note is that we continue to have very strong volunteer participation in the stipend position at KWD. This means that more days than not, the engine is staffed 4-0! We are continuing to move forward with the process of re-organization with both Boards and held another joint Consolidation subcommittee meeting last week. We have completed the Re-Organization Information Sheet. We are engaged with LAFCO and the Mapping company to determine the process for adding 7 parcels of CSA-40 territory off of Pythian Rd to our re-organization and are making progress on the other elements of the LAFCO Application.
- 3. REDCOM Update: AMR issued a 120-day termination notice to the REDCOM JPA with an effective termination date of 10/8. REDCOM Board is working hard to ensure continuity of service to our communities and first responders, and to ensure that all employees are kept whole as we transition to a new model of staffing for REDCOM. The REDCOM JPA has officially become the employing agency! We have contingency plans for both technical and staffing sides of the operations. Our next special meeting will be on 10/10 at 2 pm.
- 4. Measure H update: We continue to move forward with all implementation plans. We have filled the Regional Veg Mgt Coordinator position.
- 5. I attended the annual CAJPA Conference in Tahoe.
- 6. We held our monthly Command Staff meeting on 10/1.
- 7. I attended the monthly Cal Chiefs E-Board, Northern Area Directors, and Leg Task Force meetings.
- 8. I attended the monthly SCFCA Meeting. This month will be at the Healdsburg Station on 10/9.

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B. INCIDENTS:

- 1. Fire Season: We currently have one member out as a Fire Line Medic.
- 2. No significant local incidents.
- 3. We did provide both an engine and ambulance coverage to the Rancho Adobe and Petaluma FDs for Captain Heard's services. We also sent an engine for the static display at the service.

C. BUDGET/FINANCE:

- 1. We are working on Budget projections for the LAFCO Application.
- 2. We continue working on Measure H revenues and expenses both for SVFD as well as the SCFCA.

D. PERSONNEL:

- 1. Our new Administrative Assistant Teresa Chavez will be starting on 10/15.
- 2. Our new Regional Vegetation Management Coordinator, Captain Mason Lewis, will be starting on 10/15.
- 3. Engineer's Ryan McCracken and Rodd Kneeland have been promoted to Captain and will begin in their new roles the week of 10/15. Captain Kneeland will be assigned to the Kenwood Station on B-Shift
- 4. We have announced Engineer and Battalion Chief exams that will take place later this month and in November.

E. TRAINING:

- 1. This month's calendar will focus on Company Choice, EMS topics, and School Tours.
- 2. Volunteer drills are being split into two locations for better logistics and localized training. This has been very successful. Volunteer drills have been on Rope Rescue.

F. EQUIPMENT:

- 1. Apparatus spec committee has completed specifications for a new Type 6 engine to potentially serve District 1.
- 2. Two new Tahoes are being brought to you as a separate item.

G. BUILDINGS & LAND:

FIRST AMENDMENT TO FIRE PROTECTION AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN SONOMA VALLEY FIRE DISTRICT AND KENWOOD FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT

THIS FIRST AMENDMENT ("First Amendment") to the Fire Protection and Emergency Medical Services Agreement between Sonoma Valley Fire District and Kenwood Fire Protection District, effective, July 1, 2024, by and between the Sonoma Valley Fire District, a California special district, hereinafter referred to as "SON," and the Kenwood Fire Protection District, a California special district, hereinafter referred to as "KWD," and jointly referred to as "Parties."

RECITALS

WHEREAS, SON and KWD entered into the *Fire Protection and Emergency Medical Services Agreement* (the "Agreement") effective October 1, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement provided that SON would provide KWD with fire and emergency medical services within the service boundaries of KWD including fire personnel staffing levels at 2-0 (two full time staff per shift); and

WHEREAS, the Agreement contemplated that the Parties would pursue opportunities to increase the level of staffing to 3-0; and

WHEREAS, with the passage of Sonoma County Sale Tax Measure H providing additional funding for fire services in Sonoma County, the Parties agree to increase staffing levels to 3-0 within the service boundaries of KWD.

FIRST AMENDMENT

1. The first paragraph of EXHIBIT A to the Agreement shall be amended as follows: Staffing

Fire stations will be staffed with a minimum of 3 full-time personnel per shift in the following ranks and certifications:

2. The fourth paragraph of EXHIBIT A to the Agreement entitled "Fire Inspections and Investigations" is delated and replaced with the following paragraph as follows:

Fire Inspections and Investigations

The SON will establish fire inspection zones for each fire station and establish fire code prescribed frequencies for required inspections. SON will assume and manage and take full responsibility for all fire code related inspections for KWD, including but not limited to fire code, new and remodel construction inspections, plan checks, defensible space inspections, wildland mitigation inspections and fire investigations. Inspections in general business occupancies such as office complexes and retail outlets will be inspected every two years. Fire investigators will be available to fire scenes for fire cause determination 24 hours per day. SON will collect and retain all fire related inspection fees, which KDW will not share in.

3. 3.1.0 of the Agreement is amended with respect to the compensation for services from SON to KWD for years 2, 3, 4, and 5 of the Agreement as follows:

MISCELLANEOUS AGREEMENTS

- **4. Defined Terms**. Defined terms used in this First Amendment which are not defined herein shall have the same meaning as set forth in the Agreement.
- **5. Captions**. The section headings or captions appearing in this First Amendment are for convenience only, are not a part of this First Amendment and are not to be considered in interpreting this First Amendment.
- **6. Counterparts**. This First Amendment may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which taken together shall constitute but one and the same document.
- 7. Entire Agreement; Modification. Except as expressly set forth herein, all terms of the Fire Protection and Emergency Medical Services Agreement between Sonoma Valley Fire District and Kenwood Fire Protection District remain in full force and effect. There are no verbal agreements that change this First Amendment, and no waiver of any of their respective terms will be effective, unless in writing executed by the Parties.

Executive Summary

Request: This request before the Board is to purchase two new Chevy Tahoe Command Vehicles for the expansion of our Chief Officer services that were approved at the September SVFD BOD meeting, with additional measure H funding.

Background: As our district continues to grow in size and personnel, we have determined the need for additional utility vehicles. We are often finding ourselves having to utilize vehicles that have high mileage, and that are in poor mechanical condition, to conduct our daily operations effectively. Through Measure H funds, we have identified the need for additional administration, which the SVFD BOD approved at September meeting. Adding these vehicles will add capacity to our fleet moving forward, as they will be assigned to the Deputy Chief Officers. We do have funds in our capitol replacement funding for this purchase.


State law requires any local agency that imposes development impact fees to prepare an annual report providing specific information about those fees. Therefore, in accordance with the provisions of the California Government Code Section 66006 (b) and 66001 (d), as amended by Assembly Bill (AB) 518 and Senate Bill (SB) 1693, I hereby submit the Development Impact Fee (DIF) Report for Sonoma Valley Fire District, California for the fiscal year (FY) ended June 30, 2024.

DIFs are charged by local governmental agencies in connection with approval of development projects. The purpose of these fees is to defray all or a portion of the cost of public facilities related to the development project. The legal requirements for enactment of a DIF program are set forth in Government Code §§ 66000-66025 (the "Mitigation Fee Act"), the bulk of which was adopted as 1987's AB 1600 and thus commonly referred to as "AB 1600 requirements".

For Sonoma Valley Fire District, DIFs are collected by the County of Sonoma on behalf of the district for the purpose of mitigating the impacts caused by new development on the district's infrastructure. Fees are used to finance the acquisition, construction and improvement of public facilities needed as a result of this new development. A separate fund (10196) has been established to account for the impact of new development.

Fees imposed on new development within the Sonoma Valley Fire District within Sonoma County have been in place since July, 1 2021. In 2021, the district contracted with SCI Consulting Group in which they conducted a Fire Impact Fee Nexus Study that detailed the impacts of future growth on local facilities. This report provided the analysis and support for the DIFs imposed by the Sonoma Valley Fire District. This study was adopted by the Sonoma Valley Fire District's Board of Directors by resolution on February 9, 2021. An agreement for services dated March 23, 2021 was entered between the County of Sonoma, a political subdivision of the State of California, and Sonoma Valley Fire District to establish and administer development impact fees for fire protection services







State law requires the district prepare and make available to the public the DIF Report within 180 days after the last day of each fiscal year. The County Council must review the annual report at a regularly scheduled public meeting not less than fifteen days after the information is made available to the public. This report was filed with the County Administrator's Office and available for public review on October 8, 2024.





Executive Summary

In anticipation of future operational needs, we would like to secure a line of credit to ensure no disruption of District business. We do have reserves we are currently utilizing, but in anticipation of closing on our land purchase this will result in a large reduction of those available funds. Additionally, we have had a very heavy OES season and are still waiting for reimbursements to be received from Federal and State agencies with no set timeframe of when those may be realized.
